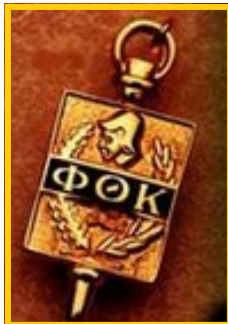

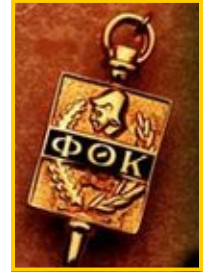
AN ALUMNI'S POINT OF VIEW
